"It's a Matter of Perception" Luke 20:19-26

- I. WHAT THE JEWS PERCEIVED (vv.19-21)
 - A. Their perception (v.19b)
 - 1. The perceived they were the "husbandmen" in the parable
 - a. Luke 20:9, "A certain man planted a vineyard, and let it forth to husbandmen, and went into a far country for a long time"
 - b. Luke 20:10, "the husbandmen beat him, and sent him away empty"
 - c. 20:14, "But when the husbandmen saw him, they reasoned among themselves, saying, This is the heir: come, let us kill him"
 - d. Luke 20:16, "He shall come and destroy these husbandmen, and shall give the vineyard to others"
 - B. Their plan (vv.19a, 20-21)
 - 1. They planned to take Jesus (v.19a)
 - 2. They planned to trap Jesus (v.20)
 - 3. They planned to trick Jesus (v.21)
- II. WHAT JESUS PERCEIVED (vv.22-25)
 - A. What Jesus asked (v.22)
 - 1. The question was about paying tribute (taxes)
 - 2. The question was "is it lawful?"
 - 3. The question was to put Jesus in an inescapable dilemma
 - B. What Jesus answered (vv.23-25)
 - 1. He perceived their craftiness or trickery (v.23)
 - 2. He asked to see a penny (v.24)
 - 3. He uttered a profound statement (v.25)
 - a. The right of government, "Render therefore unto Caesar the things which be Caesar's"
 - b. The right of God, "and unto God the things which be God's"
